A prayer of repentance

Praises from Matins of Saturday of the third week of Pascha

Verse 1: Praise Him for His mighty acts, praise Him according to the multitude of His greatness.

Everything that has breath and every creature glorifies You, O Lord, for through Your Cross You have destroyed death and thus shown the multitude of peoples Your Resurrection from the dead, for You alone love mankind.

Verse 2: Praise Him with the sound of the trumpet. Praise Him with the psaltery and harp.

Let the Israelites tell how the soldiers lost the King they were guarding. Why then did the stone not guard the Rock of life? Either let them give up the one who was buried or worship Him as risen, exclaiming together with us, "Glory to the multitude of Your mercies, O Savior, glory to Thee!"

Verse 3: Praise Him with timbrel and dance. Praise Him with strings and flute.

Rejoice O people and be glad. For an angel sat upon the grave stone and has given us good tidings saying, "Christ is risen from the dead and has filled the universe with sweet fragrance. Rejoice O people and be glad!"

Verse 4: Praise Him with tuneful cymbals, praise Him with cymbals of jubilation. Let every breath praise the Lord.

Before Your conception, O Lord, an angel brought the greeting “Rejoice!” to the one full of grace. At Your Resurrection an angel rolled away the stone from Your glorious grave. The one revealed the signs of joy instead of sorrow; the other instead of death has proclaimed to us the Master, and giver of life. Therefore we sing to You, “O Benefactor of all mankind, Lord, glory to You!”

Verse 5: Glory to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit, now and ever and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Mary Magdalene and the other Mary came to the tomb, seeking the Lord. And they beheld an angel like lightning sitting upon the stone, and saying to them, “Why do you seek the Living among the dead? He is risen as He said. You will find Him in Galilee.” Therefore let us sing to Him, “O Lord, You arose from the dead, glory to You.”

TODAY'S SCRIPTURE READINGS

Acts 9:20-31

²⁰ and immediately he began to proclaim Jesus in the synagogues, saying, “He is the Son of God.” ²¹ All who heard him were amazed and said, “Is not this the man who made havoc in Jerusalem among those who invoked this name? And has he not come here for the purpose of bringing them bound before the chief priests?” ²² Saul became increasingly more powerful and confounded the Jews who lived in Damascus by proving that Jesus was the Christ. ²³ After some time had passed, the Jews plotted to kill him, ²⁴ but their plot became known to Saul. They were watching the gates day and night so that they might kill him; ²⁵ but his disciples took him by night and let him down through an opening in the wall, lowering him in a basket. ²⁶ When he had come to Jerusalem, he attempted to join the disciples; and they were all afraid of him, for they did not believe that he was a disciple. ²⁷ But Barnabas took him, brought him to the apostles, and described for them how on the road he had seen the Lord, who had spoken to him, and how in Damascus he had spoken boldly in the name of Jesus. ²⁸ So he went in and out among them in Jerusalem, speaking boldly in the name of the Lord. ²⁹ He spoke and argued with the Hellenists; but they were attempting to kill him. ³⁰ When the believers learned of it, they

brought him down to Caesarea and sent him off to Tarsus. ³¹ Meanwhile the church throughout Judea, Galilee, and Samaria had peace and was built up. Living in the fear of the Lord and in the comfort of the Holy Spirit, it increased in numbers.

John 15:17-16:2

¹⁷ I am giving you these commands so that you may love one another. ¹⁸ “If the world hates you, be aware that it hated me before it hated you. ¹⁹ If you belonged to the world, the world would love you as its own. Because you do not belong to the world, but I have chosen you out of the world—therefore the world hates you. ²⁰ Remember the word that I said to you, ‘Servants are not greater than their master.’ If they persecuted me, they will persecute you; if they kept my word, they will keep yours also. ²¹ But they will do all these things to you on account of my name, because they do not know him who sent me. ²² If I had not come and spoken to them, they would not have sin; but now they have no excuse for their sin. ²³ Whoever hates me hates my Father also. ²⁴ If I had not done among them the works that no one else did, they would not have sin. But now they have seen and hated both me and my Father. ²⁵ It was to fulfill the word that is written in their law, ‘They hated me without a cause.’ ²⁶ “When the Advocate comes, whom I will send to you from the Father, the Spirit of truth who comes from the Father, he will testify on my behalf. ²⁷ You also are to testify because you have been with me from the beginning. **16** ¹ “I have said these things to you to keep you from stumbling. ² They will put you out of the synagogues. Indeed, an hour is coming when those who kill you will think that by doing so they are offering worship to God.

PRAYER FOR DOCTORS AND NURSES

SAINT OF THE DAY

Bishop-martyr Basil, Bishop of Amasea

Saint Basil, Bishop of Amasea, lived at the beginning of the fourth century in the Pontine city of Amasea. He encouraged and comforted the Christians suffering persecution by the pagans. During this time the Eastern part of the Roman Empire was ruled by Licinius (311-324), the brother-in-law of the holy emperor Constantine the Great. Licinius deceitfully signed Saint Constantine's Edict of Milan (313), which granted religious toleration to Christians, but he hated them and continued to persecute them.

Saint Basil sheltered a young woman for whom Licinius burned with lustful passion. For this the saint was arrested. At the trial saint Basil

resolutely refused the suggestion of the emperor to become a pagan high-priest, and therefore he was sentenced to death by beheading. The relics of saint Basil were transferred to Amasea and buried in the church built by him.

Troparion

As a minister of the King of glory, you withstood the lawless king,
O blessed and glorious Bishop-martyr Basil.
When you were beheaded,
you entered the heavenly mansions rejoicing.

By defying the emperor's decree
you were granted the Kingdom of heaven.
Remember us who faithfully celebrate your memory while you rejoice.
